Cathy Holtmann is the director of the Muriel McQueen Fergusson Centre for Family Violence Research (MMFC), and the academic co-chair of the Religion and Violence as well as the Violence against Immigrant and Visible Minority Women research teams at the Centre. She also is a co-investigator with the Canadian research team on the project Violence Against Women Migrants and Refugees: Analyzing Causes and Effective Policy Response. Her research focuses on gender and religion, domestic violence, immigrant women, and social action.

Nicole Letourneau is the scientific director of AVA, director of RESOLVE Alberta and the principal investigator of the CHILD Studies program, and is a professor in the Faculty of Nursing and Cumming School of Medicine at the University of Calgary. She currently holds a Research Chair in Parent and Child Mental Health. Her research focuses on understanding how parental mental health, violence and adversity affect children's health and creating, testing, and implementing interventions to promote children's health.
